



New Mexico State University System 2024 Preliminary Post-Session Report February 19, 2024

At noon, Thursday, February 15, 2024, the 2024 State of New Mexico Legislative Session concluded, sending 87 bills to Governor Michelle Lujan Grisham for signature, veto, partial veto, or pocket veto (the latter in which the Governor rejects a bill by not taking any action). As the primary focus of a shorter, 30-day session (held in even years) is to craft a spending plan for the upcoming fiscal year, much of that which was accomplished pertains to the state budget (House Bills 2 and 3), a tax package (House Bill 252), and capital outlay packages (House Bill 308 and Senate Bills 246 and 275). New Mexico State University, along with the state's other higher education institutions, stands to receive increased operational funding, compensation for employees, and infrastructure and deferred maintenance money, among many other items, once the bills become law.

Given that the Governor has until March 6, 2024 to take action on items that passed both Chambers, the following breakdown of key impacts to higher education should be considered tentative. Following the March 6 date, our office will update this report to reflect any changes resulting from the Governor's actions. During this period, our office will be working with the Governor's office to preserve all appropriations received through the various funding streams.

For now, here are the key highlights beginning with those items impacting all higher education and then those items specific to New Mexico State University.

Statewide higher education support:

- Passage of Senate Bill 159, creating the Higher Education Trust Fund. The Trust Fund will receive a \$959 million transfer pending action by the Governor. \$10.6 million is earmarked for shortfalls in Opportunity Scholarship funding.
- \$23.8 million in instruction and general funding to all higher education institutions, an increase of 3% from the previous fiscal year. This increase includes earmarks for targeted faculty compensation, student support services, and support for graduate assistants.

- \$33 million in funding to provide a 3% across-the-board compensation increase to all non-probationary employees. Additional funding of \$9.4 million will be distributed to institutions as a partial offset to insurance premium increases.
- \$32.5 million for Building Renewal and Replacement and Demolition
- \$5 million for Equipment Renewal and Replacement
- \$5.5 million to K-12 and higher education institutions for cybersecurity
- \$1 million for Dual Credit programs at higher education institutions
- \$10 million for graduate scholarships to New Mexico graduates in STEM programs
- \$10 million for social work endowed faculty positions, financial aid and paid practicums
- \$10 million in new funding and a \$15 million authorization from the Technology Enhancement Fund to support research institutions in match requirements
- \$60 million in workforce training tuition coverage to be spent over three fiscal years
- \$6 million in funding for Integrated Basic Education and Skills Training programs to be spend over three fiscal years

New Mexico State University System-specific support:

- \$10.8 million in increased instruction and general funding and support for Research and public service projects

- \$22 million in one-time funding including support for Global Campus, the Creative Media Institute, Athletics, the College of Engineering's Manufacturing Sector Development Program, and the Department of Agriculture.

- \$6.8 million in earmarked funding through the Government Responsibility and Opportunity Fund, to be spent over two fiscal years.

- \$ 90 million in funding for capital outlay projects
