On April 5, 2022, the State Legislature convened for a Special Session called by the Governor. Two items were up for consideration, the first being Senate Bill 48---also known as the Junior bill--- which the Governor had vetoed a little under a month ago. The second item was a proposed taxpayer relief package to alleviate hardships created by rising fuel prices and inflation.

The Legislature completed its work relatively quickly, producing a revamped Junior bill that addressed the Governor's concerns about transparency and fiscal responsibility, and a set of tax rebates to be sent out to taxpayers at dates later this year.

The Junior bill, Senate Bill 1 in its newest iteration, contains more than \$50 million in funding for projects in legislators' districts, including nearly \$6 million in NMSU and NMSU-related items. The table and charts on the following pages highlight those programs that received funding, while also delineating whether the funding is intended to be recurring or non-recurring, according to the desires of the sponsoring legislators. The Department of Finance and Administration will make the final decision on the recurring/nonrecurring status of the provided funding.

As far as relief for taxpayers, House Bill 2 provides two payments to New Mexicans over the coming year that amount to \$500 for individuals and \$1,000 to married couples. The first payments are slated to go out before June 30, 2022, to fall under the current fiscal year, FY22, while the second are scheduled for the month of August, during Fiscal Year 2023. This bill contains an emergency clause, which means it becomes effective as soon as Governor Lujan Grisham signs it.

The Governor has until April 25, 2022 to sign the bill. It is important to note that both bills await the Governor's signature as of today, April 7, 2022. The Office of Government and Community Relations will most certainly provide an email update once that takes place.
